Gandhian Studies Centre

Gandhian Studies Centre conducted seminar on 30th September 2022 in the Auditorium, Main Building. The speaker for the Seminar was Dr Hubnath Pandey, Head of the Hindi Department, University of Mumbai. In his speech he told about Gandhiji's views on Indian diet in particular about scientific basis of vegetarian diet. He explained Gandhiji's views on the importance of speaking truth in life. He emphasized that Gandhiji stressed on character of individual in terms of good and bad habits. Students learn about the significance of ethics and morals in one's life. The honourable Chairperson Shri Rohidasji Patil, Secretary Shri Maheshji Mhatre and Principal Dr V N Yadav were present for the programme. Total 58 students and 12 staff were present for the same.

The Gandhian Studies Centre observed Khadi Day on 3rd October 2022 on the occasion of 154th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. All the students, teaching and non-teaching staff were appealed to wear Khadi Dress to promote handwoven khadi for 'Gram Udyog' - Rural self-employment and it was followed by all. The students from Gandhian Studies Centre gave short speech on the process of khadi wooven and Art in all the class rooms.

On 4th the Pledge for non violence and peace given by members of Gandhian studies centre by visiting to all the class rooms. Thus Gandhian Studies Centre celebrated Gandhiji's 154th birth anniversary by conducting various programmes.

On 30th January 2023 seminar on Gandhiji's Assassination was conducted by GSC. The speaker for the Seminar was Prof Sunil Dhapse, Department of History and social activist. This seminar was conducted to observe death anniversary of Gandhiji. Prof Dhapse sequentially unfold historical milestone in Gandhiji's activities for the nation. He explained that though Gandhiji's work including non violence philosophy was adhered and followed by majority, few people were against his idealism. Gradually, the negativity raised to a vast extent. This eventually lead to Assasination of Gandhiji. This seminar was intended to threw light on Gandhiji's thoughts of non violence and attempted to reduce myths about his assasination. For this seminar 40 students, 10 teachers and Principal Dr V N Yadav were present. The seminar was successful with extended cooperation from Management, Principal and Members of GSC.
